Following the success of the inaugural **Osteoarthritis Aotearoa New Zealand Base Camp** in 2021, the **Osteoarthritis Aotearoa New Zealand (OAAoNZ) 2022 Summit** builds on the foundations laid by this towards:

- Continuing to co-create a national Model of Care for osteoarthritis care for Aotearoa New Zealand.
- Developing a list of national priorities in osteoarthritis research.

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

The Summit will feature world-renowned international keynote speakers who will discuss their various OA models of care and the opportunities and challenges that come with these. They include:

- **Prof Søren Skou:** Professor at the Research Unit for Musculoskeletal Function and Physiotherapy at the University of Southern Denmark and head of research at the Department of Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy, Næstved-Slagelse-Ringsted Hospitals, Denmark.
- **Prof Andrew Briggs:** Professor Briggs currently co-leads a team in the emerging field of health policy and systems research at Curtin University, Western Australia.
- **Assoc. Prof Jackie Whittaker:** Associate Professor in the Department of Physical Therapy, at the University of British Columbia and is recognised as a Clinical Specialist in Musculoskeletal Physiotherapy by the Canadian Physiotherapy Association.
